

Harvey Tibbs - Over the past two decades, trombonist Harvey Tibbs has been performing in New York, specializing in traditional jazz and swing styles. He is the leader and arranger of the Hudson Valley Swing Band, an eight-piece group that has been active since 1993. As a veteran of the United States Army, he was stationed at West Point, NY, performing with the West Point Band Jazz Knights for 22 years. He has played with the Galvanized Jazz Band, Swing Street, and the Buck Clayton Orchestra. He continues to perform regularly with Vince Giordano's Nighthawks, appearing with the band on the Grammy Award winning soundtrack to the HBO series Boardwalk Empire. His Broadway show credits include 42nd Street, Chicago, In The Heights, Memphis, Kinky Boots, and Bullets Over Broadway. Harvey has toured internationally on three occasions with the Benny Goodman Tribute Band, led by Ken Peplowski. Harvey's CD credits include the award-winning centennial tribute to Bix Beiderbecke, Celebrating Bix, and Vince Giordano's Nighthawks featuring Randy Reinhart, Jon-Erik Kellso, Randy Sandke, Dan Barrett, Scott Robinson, Dan Levinson, Mark Shane, Dick Hyman, Howard Alden, Vince Giordano, Greg Cohen, and Joe Ascione. Since 2008, Harvey has been a music educator in the New York area, teaching for the Paul Effman Music Service.



Trumpeter/composer Josh Deutsch has established himself as a versatile and unique voice on New York City's contemporary music scene. where he performs regularly as a leader and sideman and is a founding member of the Queens Jazz Overground, a collective dedicated to making the borough where he resides a destination for live improvised music. He is also known nationally and internationally through performances around the U.S. and in Europe, Canada and Asia. Deutsch leads the bands Pannonia and the Josh

Deutsch Quintet. Formed in 2011, Pannonia's debut album, Another Time, Another Place was released in 2014, and was an editors pick in Downbeat magazine, which calls it "a well-planned, beautifully executed program" and praises the "superb solos," "incredible humor" and "deep compositions."

Deutsch also performs in a duo with guitarist Nico Soffiato that has toured extensively in Italy and the U.S. Guitar International hailed their recording Time Gels (2011) as "an elegant, fresh take on the timeless (duo) tradition" and praised the duo's ability to "perform as a cohesive unit with improvisational vigor and mature musicianship."

Deutsch and Soffiato host the 2x3 Series presenting a trio of diverse duos in a night of separate and collaborative performances at various NYC venues. The trumpeter plays regularly and has recorded with Argentinian singer/composer Sofia Rei, Pedro Giraudo's Expansions Big Band, the Australian soul/funk band The Hipstones, Nathan Parker Smith's Large Ensemble and Colombian folkloric band Grupo Rebolu, and has performed with Darcy James Argue's Secret Society and the Duke Ellington Big Band directed by Victor Goines. He has presented his own projects at Dave Douglas's Festival of New Trumpet Music as well as at the Earshot Jazz Festival in Seattle and the Outpost Summer Music Festival in Albuquerque and appeared at such leading venues in the U.S. as The Jazz Standard, Birdland, The Blue Note, The Jazz Gallery and The Stone in New York City and Yoshi's in Oakland. Deutsch writes music in multiple genres and his compositions and arrangements have been performed by artists ranging from the Seattle Symphony Orchestra and cellist Ruth Marshall to the Oregon Jazz Ensemble, Ron Miles and Danilo Pérez. He has received commissions from the NPR radio program "From The Top," the Seattle Symphony Orchestra, Music Northwest and the Head-Royce School. In addition to having composed hundreds of pieces for various performing ensembles, Deutsch has also written several long-form pieces including "The Ligeti Project," a 12-movement, cross-genre work for jazz septet that has been performed on both the East and West Coasts that is based loosely on Györgi Ligeti's Musica Ricercata.
