OCMEA JUNIOR HIGH SCHOOL JAZZ CONDUCTOR

Timothy E. Hooker is the Director of Bands at Mamaroneck High School in Mamaroneck, New York, a position he has held for 20 years. During his more than 30 years in education, he has created quality music with his students, introducing them to great composers, arrangers, and giving them many meaningful musical experiences. Mr. Hooker believes in making the musical learning path powerful, authentic, and life-lasting, which has led him to give his



students off-campus experiences and in-school masterclasses. His ensembles have been finalists in some of the largest jazz festivals in the northeast, such as the Essentially Ellington Festival in NYC, the Villanova University Jazz Festival in Philadelphia, PA, the Berklee College of Music HS Jazz Festival in Boston, and the North American Music Festival in Virginia Beach. Several bands under Mr. Hooker's direction have been invited to perform at the All-State Music Conference in Rochester, NY, the All-Eastern Conference in Providence, RI, B. B. Kings and Iridium NYC at the Band Director's Academy, and the Westchester County HS Jazz Festivals in NY

Mr. Hooker continues to do freelance performing when time permits. He has performed with the Westchester Pops Orchestra, The Hudson Valley Wind Symphony, Doug McClean Blues Band, Big Band East and The Jim Chapin Band. Over the years Mr. Hooker has had the good fortune to work with The Joyce DiCamillo Trio, Todd Coolman, Justin DiCioccio, Sean Smith Trio, Lauren Sevian, Delfeayo Marsalis, Ralph Lalama and Chembo Corniel. He has been a Presenter at the NYSSMA All-State Conference and at the National Music Conference in Kansas City, Missouri. For several years he was the Coordinator of the Westchester HS Jazz Festival, and he has been recognized by Westchester Magazine as continuing to have the best high school band in the county. Mr. Hooker has been a guest conductor throughout the tri-state area and a guest adjudicator at many music schools in the NY area.

Although Mr. Hooker has been in music education for quite some time, he feels that there is always more music to teach, play, and hear. Each group of new students presents new challenges and opportunities to expand on their knowledge and repertoire. Mr. Hooker is always learning and discovering new techniques, ideas or just a new twist on how to hear or interpret something. His goal in music education is to continue to share the joy of making quality music, helping students build lasting relationships through their love of music, and continuing to share helpful insights on how to be a successful performer.

Mr. Hooker is looking forward to working with this very talented group of young people in Orange County.

OCMEA VOCAL JAZZ CONDUCTOR



Mr. Jeffrey Welcher received his Bachelor of Music degree from the Crane School of Music at Potsdam College in Potsdam, NY and his Master of Music Education degree from West Chester University in West Chester, PA. Mr. Welcher is currently an adjunct professor at Syracuse University, where he serves as the director of Windjammer, the vocal jazz ensemble at SU and as the jazz voice studio teacher in the Setnor School of Music's Jazz/Commercial Applied Music Program. He is also a student teaching field supervisor for

the Setnor School of Music. Mr. Welcher has conducted festival choirs throughout New York State as well as All-State jazz ensembles in Rhode Island and New Hampshire. For 23 years he was the Vocal Music Director at Oneida High School in Oneida, New York where he conducted Concert Choir, Freshman Boys Chorus, Girls Chorus, Vocal Jazz Ensemble, Chamber Choir, and two contemporary a cappella groups. Before that, Mr. Welcher was the Junior and Senior High Vocal/General Music Teacher at Greene Central School in Greene, NY.

Mr. Welcher served as the New York State School Music Association Conference Vocal Jazz Ensemble Chairman for the 1997-1998 and 2001-2002 conferences. He is a certified NYSSMA Vocal Jazz Adjudicator, is on the NYSSMA Manual committee as vocal jazz editor, and is a certified judge for the International Championship of Collegiate A Cappella. He was a member of the teaching staff for the Summer Vocal Institute at Providence College from 2003-2007 and the ACDA Eastern Division Repertoire and Standards Committee Chairman for Vocal Jazz from 2000-2006. He is currently serving as the Jazz representative for NYACDA's Repertoire and Resources Committee.

Recently, Mr. Welcher served as the coordinator for the 2010 Eastern Division High School Men's Honor Choir and served as guest conductor for the choirs at Colgate University in the fall of 2010. He was also the 2003 recipient of the Syracuse Symphony Musicians Award for Outstanding Choral Director. He has performed with the Syracuse Vocal Ensemble since 1998 and is an active jazz vocalist/pianist and church musician.

OCMEA HIGH SCHOOL JAZZ CONDUCTOR



Nathan Childers is an accomplished saxophonist, educator, and composer. He began his musical study on the piano at age seven and started playing professional saxophone gigs at the age of thirteen. Has has earned degrees from the Eastman School of Music (MM in Jazz Studies and Contemporary Media) and the University of Massachusetts (BM in Jazz Studies and Afro-American Music; BM in Classical

Saxophone Performance). He has performed with such legendary artists as the Glenn Miller Orchestra, the Birdland Big Band, the Broadway Theater League Orchestra, Daryl Hall, Frankie Valli, Jimmy Dorsey Orchestra, the Temptations, the Tommy Dorsey Orchestra, and the Cab Calloway Orchestra. He also played lead also as part of the Buddy Rich Memorial Live Concert and DVD. His performances have taken him to the Beacon Theater, Birdland, Broadway theatres, Iridium, and Jazz Cruise, and the Vail Jazz Festival. His performances have been recognized by several national organizations such as Downbeat Magazine, Saxophone Journal, Hilton Head Jazz Society, and the US State Department.

As an educator, Nathan has conducted clinics, workshops, and presentations at Amherst College, the Eastman School of Music, Ithaca College, Rutgers University, The University of Massachusetts, the Jazz Education Network, and the US Scholastic Band Association. He has been a saxophone instructor and manager of the MILES (Music in the Lower East Side) band program at the Third Street Music School Settlement in lower Manhattan and is currently the director of the Horizons Music Academy in New Canaan, CT. His compositions have been recognized by the BMI Composers Workshop, ASCAP, and the Amherst College Department of Music. He is currently the music composer for the Visual Learning Company.
