Richard Guillen, a native of Kearney, New Jersey, received his Bachelor's Degree in Music Education from Kean University of New Jersey and his Master's Degree in Music Education from Western Connecticut State University. Since 1997, Mr. Guillen has been the director of bands at Arlington High School in Dutchess County, NY.

He previously served as director of bands at Central Regional High School in Bayville, NJ from 1989-1997. Mr. Guillen's current responsibilities include serving as the district's Music Coordinator as well as the director of the Arlington High School Wind Ensemble, the most advanced of the school's five concert bands. He is also the director of jazz programs at his school, serving as the director of the award-winning Arlington Jazz Machine, the most advanced of the school's three jazz ensembles, and assisting with the school's other two jazz ensembles. His marching, concert, and jazz ensembles have consistently received awards and accolades and performed at local and regional festivals. The Arlington High School Wind Ensemble made its Carnegie Hall debut in 2014, and the Jazz Machine has attended the prestigious Berklee Jazz Festival in Boston 20 times, winning 1st place four times and placing in the top three every year since 2007.

Aside from his duties at Arlington High School, Mr. Guillen is also an active freelance arranger, composer and program consultant for many competitive marching bands and drum corps. He has been invited to work with various musical organizations around the country as a clinician, adjudicator, and guest conductor. As a performer, he was a member of the Cadets Drum and Bugle Corps (formerly the Garfield Cadets) and the Sunrisers Drum and Bugle Corps. He has worked with Bob Mintzer, Phil Wilson, Greg Hopkins, Andy Fusco, and Bob Yurochko. He currently resides in the town of LaGrange, NY with his wife and four daughters and feels truly blessed.

Known throughout New York's Capital District as a composer, conductor, low brass performer, and high school instrumental music director, **Michael Blostein** has a wide range of musical experiences and areas of expertise with with to draw from. As an educator he has taught orchestra at Averill Park High School for the last 19 years, as well as band and jazz ensemble for the last 8.

Under his direction, the Averill Park High School Instrumental Music program has earned multiple awards and accolades, including performances at New York's Avery Fisher and Carnegie Halls. Students who have chosen to continue to study music at the collegiate level have been accepted at a wide range of schools, including the Crane School of Music, Manhattan School of Music, Harvard, Ithaca College, Lawrence Conservatory, Fredonia School of Music, and Nazareth, to name a few. For the last seven years, he has also been the co-conductor of the Delmar Community Orchestra.

His education includes a Bachelor's degree in Music Education from the Crane School of Music at SUNY Potsdam and a Master's degree in Composition from the University of Arizona. Further studies have been undertaken at Villanova University, UMass Amherst, and The Juilliard School. He has been included as a contributing writer in the All-Music Guide and the All-Music Guide to Classical Music, and was a Grammy Educator quarter-finalist in 2017.

In addition to teaching, he is an active performer with the Georgie Wonders Orchestra and Brass-O-Mania big bands on bass trombone, Capital Brass on tenor trombone and tuba, and the Dominant Five Brass Quintet and Old Time Dance Band on tuba. He also sustains an active performance schedule as a freelance performer.
